This coming year has brought us its share of sadness with COVID - 19, which forced us to cancel Le Bonheur Musical and also caused the death of Claude Sauer, the founder of Le Bonheur Musical with his wife Emmy. In this newsletter you will find a tribute to Claude.

Claude Sauer,

Claude Sauer, the founder of Bonheur Musical, passed away on November 13th, swept away by illness.

Claude, born in Strasbourg on March 3, 1938, fruit of the union of his father Henri, and his mother, Lucie, spent his early childhood in Auvergne (from 1939 to 1945, his father had left Germany in the 1920's to settle in Alsace ...) completed his college and high school in Strasbourg, as well as the music conservatory with a concentration in piano, then graduated from L'Ecole Centrale des Arts et Manufactures (Centrale Paris) in 1961.

Doctor in Applied Mathematics, he began his career at the Omnium Technique de l'Habitat (OTH), a very important Parisian engineering and design office, a subsidiary of Paribas specializing in development and infrastructure studies ... Projects on the Adriatic coast (development of tourism in Croatia, Montenegro, Serbia)... the Balkans including Greece... Cyprus... as well as South America in Argentina, from Ushuaia to Iguazu Falls...

He was then a UNWTO / UN Tourism Expert Consultant through the Claude Sauer Consultancy Company. He thus had the opportunity to work for the World Bank in Washington and, perfectly at ease in English (he spoke English, Spanish, German and Serbo-Croatian), he knew how to develop an important tapestry of relations, in the Middle East, in Lebanon, in Israel, in Iraq. He also worked in the 1970s and 1980s on ski resort projects abroad, with Honoré Bonnet, director of the French ski team, who lived in Pra-loup.

Claude, and his dear wife Emmy, arrived in Aix in 1977, and with their children, settled in Parc Rigaud. Claude invested a lot of his time and energy in the management of the Park. There was unanimous support at the Condominium Office. He was appreciated for his work, his advice, his generosity, his sense of consensus.

In 1980 Claude and Emmy joined the Rotary d'Aix where they made many excellent friends.

American friends had dragged him into a real estate investment in Naples, Florida. They went there at least once a year and always came back delighted.

Likewise, the Sauers had made their mark in Salzburg, where they stayed very regularly in the summer and where they had loyal friends.

We will end this tribute by highlighting the role of Claude for Le Bonheur Musical at the Château de Lourmarin.

The year is 1995. Claude and Emmy Sauer, music lovers and regulars at the Salzburg festival, become friends with Wolfgang Schulz and his wife Ulla, him solo flautist of the Vienna Philharmonic and famous worldwide. artist, both passionate about Provence. This friendship would form the basis of an extraordinary adventure, the arrival each year in June, in the enchanting setting of the Château de Lourmarin by Wolfgang, Ulla and their children Veronika and Matthias, accompanied by their great musical friends, all virtuosos, from the Camerata Schulz, the Wien-Berlin ensemble and the Viennarte trio. Le Bonheur Musical au château de Lourmarin was born.

Claude and Emmy have thus created a festival like no other. The musicians do not receive a fee, they come to play for pleasure, there is no audience in the common sense of the term, but the gathering of friends, friends of Claude and Emmy, members of parner's associations, all lovers of music and musical heritage. Thus, for 18 years the miracle of Le Bonheur Musical occurred under the direction of Claude. The 18th edition was particularly moving, dedicated to the memory of Wolfgang Schulz who died in 2013. Ulla was present and more talented than ever, despite the illness that took her away shortly thereafter.

After 2013 the children of Wolfgang Schulz would take over, accompanied, like their parents, by talented musician friends. Claude will remain faithful to Le Bonheur Musical.

Claude was also very involved in the Aix music festival through the Friends of the Festival.

In 2019, his dear wife passed away, a terrible misfortune for Claude. His last days on this earth were difficult.

We will never forget Claude's presentations at Le Bonheur Musical, they expressed a man of great character and generosity.

We offer our condolences to his children Armelle, Stéphane and Frédéric.
